## Losing Trick Count - Expected Losers

If the auction suggests you will be playing in a suit contract, you can use the following table to estimate how many losers each bid shows using the following table.

| Bid | Points | Expected Losers |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Minimum opening 1 of a suit | $12-15$ | 7 |
| Raise 1 of a suit to 2 level | $6-9$ | 9 |
| 1NT | $12-14$ | Usually 8, sometimes 7 |
| 2NT | $20-22$ | 4 losers |
| 2 | $23+$ | 3 losers or less |
| 3-level pre-empt | Under <br> 11 | 7 - non vulnerable <br> 6 - vulnerable |
| Weak Two | $6-10$ | 8 minimum - 7 with a 'feature' |
| Overcall at the 1 level | $8-16$ | 8 losers or less |
| Overcall at the 2 level | $10-16$ | 7 losers or less |
| Weak Jump Overcalls | $6-10$ | Same as Weak Twos, or 3-level <br> pre-empts |
| Takeout doubles | $12+$ | 7 losers or less |
